Water Conservation for Infrastructure - HB 4

Legislation tied to the 2012 State Water Plan. Requires funding for conservation, re-use and education.

STATUS - SIGNED BY GOVERNOR - Effective on 9/1/2013

Water Conservation for Individuals - SB 198

Allow residents of homeowners' associations the freedom to utilize water-efficient landscaping.

STATUS - SIGNED BY GOVERNOR - Effective on 9/1/2013

Green Schools - SB 700

Relating to the allocation of certain money in the Texas emissions reduction plan fund to fund the energy efficiency grant program.

STATUS - SIGNED BY GOVERNOR - Effective on 9/1/2013

PACE - SB 385

Help commercial and industrial building owners afford water and energy conservation upgrades to existing buildings via property assessments.

STATUS - **SIGNED** BY GOVERNOR - Effective immediately
